Disparities in Abnormal Mammogram Follow-Up: Communication & Care Strategies

Dr. Leah Karliner, part of UCSF's Helen Diller Family Comprehensive Cancer Center, is conducting a survey of PCPs in San Francisco to understand their experiences and perspectives on follow-up of abnormal mammogram results. Combined with interview data with women, the data resulting from this survey will identify those system-based processes of care and communication factors related to timely abnormal mammogram follow-up that are

most salient to women and referring physicians, and thus most important to be tested in a future intervention study aimed to eliminate disparities in follow-up of abnormal mammogram results for vulnerable women. The survey will be distributed this winter. Upon completion of the survey, all participants will be entered into a drawing for twenty \$250 gift certificate!
